

Dear Ones,

I love the beginning of September and the time when we begin to shift out of summer patterns. I know many of you take the summer and find time to get into the mountains, travel, or just lay low and play a round of golf. The summer is an important season for tending to our souls in a different way than the other seasons allow, though, each has its own unique way of doing so. I tend to find the summer the best time to be in the water fishing. As long as I'm not tying up my fly in the trees reaching their branches over the creek, there are few things that fill my cup more than letting the cool water rush around me as I try (emphasis on "try") to catch a fish. Summer is just such a great season for the important sabbath rest that fills our souls, but now we are transitioning into the fall. School has started and church programming is following right behind.

As noted, I like this shift because the energy that we are carrying from that time of summer sabbath is easily seen in the church when we gather. You are excited to see one another and to engage in what is happening, and there are many opportunities to be together outside of worship. On Sundays, we will have Sunday school for all ages at 9 AM. I teach the adult class in the fellowship hall and want to encourage you to try this out if you have not. For 4 weeks at a time, we explore a particular topic with lots of table conversation. In many ways, the adult Sunday school hour is quite fellowship-y. On Sept 10, we will begin with a history of the Bible including how it has been compiled and how it has been interpreted through time. Yes, interpretation has changed many times as the critical lens through which folks have read the text has shifted. I hope you'll attend this important class as we learn more about the Bible and how to read it in such a way that we do not despise it but come to love the amazing story of God's love for humanity and humanity's own experience of that love in all our successes and foibles.

The other piece of programming I want to highlight is the Sept 13 start of the third year of our midweek dinner called "the Bridge." The hope of this midweek gathering is to bridge the time between Sundays by giving another opportunity for congregational fellowship and study. Just as Jesus gathered at the table for meals with so many, we will gather together on Wednesday nights from 5:30-6:15 for a meal. Come and just enjoy the conversation together and to have a night not to cook and clean (unless you sign up to that one week for everyone). Then, if you desire, jump into the adult Bible study that night. We'll take a look at the upcoming Sunday sermon passage and field any questions that might be lingering from the previous Sunday. No preparation is needed for the study, and it's just as laid back as the meal. There will also be programming for our youth during this 6:15-7:00 time.

Beloved, there are many ways to enjoy fellowship and walk alongside one another on this journey of following Christ. Bring that sabbath energy and engage because we often find that in engaging in this journey together is exactly what continues to feed that energy and uphold us.

I am a pretty relaxed and go-with-the-flow person, but then things happen that I am like, nope, I am not anymore. I need a plan and all the information on what will happen. I have no idea how we will get from point A to point B. Ack!!!! In my mind, I envision us looking and acting like the Clampetts. I know it won't be that bad, but my brain is dramatic. When I get going, I must remind myself to take a deep breath and pray. Once I have recentered myself, I get out my notebook, pen, travel books, and notes from wonderful people who have shared their knowledge with me and start making lists of things I need to do.

When looking for experienced travelers, I turned to my church family—trusting that they would not lead me down a dark alley. I took in all the information, made notes, processed all the information, and now I am applying the knowledge to formulate a plan. I appreciated everyone taking the time to answer all my crazy questions.

Seeking those in the church who have more experience is a perfect example of what we do with our faith. We study the Bible, ask questions, and seek answers with those we trust. The conversations that evolve from the questions can be very inspirational. Coming together is what church is all about. There is a flow of information, ideas, and understanding. Each party involved grows and gains a better understanding or at least a different perspective.

I have been asked why I like working with kids. Besides the obvious that I am still a kid at heart, it is the joy of introducing the little ones to the stories and the love that surrounds us. They think about and apply the themes and lessons to their lives and surroundings as they age. They are insightful and look at things from a different perspective. It is a sense of pride when a child feels surrounded by love, safe enough to question, absorbs the information, and applies it to their faith. Then, they take that step and get confirmed. The youth are saying I have examined, I have processed, and I am confident enough to own my baptism vows.

As we kick off the new Sunday school year (September 10 at 9 a.m., be here or be square!), come knowing that all ages are welcome. I challenge you to come with the enthusiasm of a first grader with a new box of crayons, the confidence of a teenager talking to their parent, the curious mind of a two-year -old, and the trust of a baby that you will find what you are looking for even if you don't know what it is you are seeking.


